IN A DIGITAL AGE: CAN AI HELP US REFLECT MORE, NOT LESS?

We were honored to host Dr. Murat Baday, researcher at Stanford University, for a timely and thought-provoking conversation on the intersection of artificial intelligence, human attention, and spiritual well-being.

The event brought together a wonderfully diverse group of attendees: friends from our workplace community, dedicated BayCC volunteers, members of the Afghan community from Fremont, and respected guests including Imam Muhammad S. Sidk, Al Azhari, and Aisha

Othman, Esquire. Many others joined online via Zoom, creating a shared space that blended both physical and digital presence.

Dr. Baday asked us to consider a powerful question: Are we using technology to enrich our lives, or is it using us? Drawing on recent research—including studies from Stanford—he reflected on how AI is increasingly shaping our mental rhythms, often pulling us away from the very things that nourish us intellectually, spiritually, and emotionally. Despite having more tools than ever to save time, we're spending less of it in meaningful reflection and connection.



Are we using technology to enrich our lives, or is it using us?

After the prayer break, many lingered to continue the conversation, share personal insights, and simply enjoy each other's company. The warmth in the room was a reminder that, even in a digital age, what we seek most is presence—with ourselves and with one another.



# **CLEANING THE COAST, ONE BAG AT A TIME**

On a breezy Saturday morning, ten members of our youth team joined the Pacific Beach Coalition for a hands-on beach clean-up along the coast. From high school students to recent grads, the group came ready to make a difference—and have fun doing it.

The day began with a welcome from local organizers and a short introduction on the importance of protecting our beaches. Gloves on and
