WOMEN'S SOCIAL NIGHT: HENNA NIGHT

Over the past weeks, the dedicated women volunteers at BAYCC organized a truly incredible Henna Night for our sisters. It was a beautiful and joy-filled evening — the atmosphere was warm, the traditional outfits were stunning, the music and dances were uplifting, and the food was absolutely delicious. Everyone left with smiles and heartfelt gratitude.

The evening also featured a wonderful spread of food and desserts. From authentic Turkmen Pilav to a variety of delicious Turkish dishes and homemade sweets, the sisters prepared an unforgettable feast that added even more warmth to the night.

Several sisters shared touching reflections. One mother said, "As a Muslim woman, I was grateful to show my daughter how joyful, meaningful, and fun a halal gathering can be." This feedback alone captured the spirit of the night.

We were also blessed to welcome three women who are exploring or recently embraced Islam. They expressed how valuable it was to see firsthand how Muslims celebrate within the halal circle, with dignity, beauty, and warmth. This meant a lot to them.

The event drew positive attention community-wide. Sisters from the MCA women's volunteer group even visited BAYCC afterward to thank our volunteers and expressed interest in co-hosting similar programs together in the future — a wonderful sign of growing collaboration between our communities.

INTERFAITH THANKSGIVING DINNER AT LDS CHURCH

BAYCC was honored to co-host this year's Interfaith Thanksgiving Dinner, "Feast of Friendship and Gratitude: Building Communities Together," alongside The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, SiVIC, and Pacifica Institute. Held at the LDS Church in Los Altos, the gathering welcomed 250 guests from more than 20 organizations, faith communities, civic groups, and families across the Bay Area.

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Volunteers prepared the space early in the day—setting up tables and décor, supporting A/V needs, carving the turkey, and contributing homemade dishes that added to the shared meal. As guests arrived, live piano music by Ipek Ozorpak created a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

The program opened with remarks from Paul Hepworth and Esma Sultan Altun, followed by reflections on interfaith cooperation and community building from Congressman Sam Liccardo, Santa Clara City Councilmember Karen Hardy, and Assistant Special Agent in Charge Scott J. Hellman. A highlight of the evening was the "12 Months By the Bay" presentation by Anita Siu and Fatih Cansizoglu, which shared stories of Jewish and Muslim families spending a year learning, traveling, and celebrating together—an inspiring example of friendship shared experiences. nurtured through




RISALE-I NUR REFLECTION WORKSHOP

We were delighted to host a vibrant and engaging workshop dedicated to exploring the first eight Words, or chapters, of the *Risale-i Nur* through creative, modern, and interactive methods. The goal of the program was to present these profound teachings in a way that speaks to the language, challenges, and rhythms of contemporary life—making timeless truths newly accessible and meaningful.

Each of the eight Words was brought to life through a different artistic or technical format, including theater, poetry, talk-show dialogue, Algenerated video, storybook narration, illustration, and more. This diversity allowed participants to connect with the material from fresh perspectives and rediscover familiar concepts in unexpected ways.

The workshop was presented in two sessions, first covering Words 1–4 and then Words 5–8. Volunteers arrived early to prepare the space, set up seating and displays, and organize event materials. After the main presentations, the program continued with a community raffle, followed by shared food and warm conversation.



We concluded with a small exhibition of posters designed for each Word, offering attendees a visual reflection on the themes explored throughout the day.

One of the most memorable aspects of the workshop was the enthusiasm across all age groups. Participants were attentive, curious, and fully

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engaged—and even the children followed along with excitement until the very end. Their energy brought a special sense of joy and vibrancy to the gathering.

Looking ahead, we plan to offer future programs with bilingual content in both Turkish and English, introducing new themes and formats as we continue to explore the stories of the *Risale-i Nur* through creative and interactive methods.
